Week 1: Peace, Love and Summertime

Projects can include but are not limited to:

1. Painted ceramic flower pot with planted flowers
2. Tie dying – shirt and bandana
3. Handmade dream catcher
4. Textured relief painting
5. Impressionistic summertime collage
6. Peace tree
7. Straw painting

Week 2: Up in the Air and Under the Sea

Projects can include but are not limited to:

1. Galactic name wall hanging
2. Collaborative table painting
3. Handmade wind chime
4. Painted paper collage
5. Undersea textured relief painting
6. Space oil pastel watercolor resist
7. Van Gogh inspired sky painting

Week 3: Color Mania

Projects can include but are not limited to:

1. Splatter Pollock painting
2. Collaborative wall art

3. Expressive color crown
4. Color Pop-ing portrait
5. Recycled color mania robots
6. Picasso paper sculpture
7. Colorful relief cityscape

Each child is expected to bring in an old shirt to wear over their clothes or smock to protect their clothing. At the end of each week, children will prepare their work to hang in an art show, which will be at MSOE. All work will be taken home at the end of the week.
